5 Point Detail Tech Session - Jim Patterson

The Club likes to have a Car Detailing Tech Session before our annual car show. I was delighted when Adam Cote, owner of 5 Point Auto Detail, offered to do a detail session at his shop. When we discussed the format. Adam asked if I wanted to have my car used for the demo. I'm the type of person that likes to have a clean car but doesn't especially contacted me and we planning on giving it a quick wash just so that everybody wouldn't see how dirty I had let it get. Adam talked me into leaving it as is, he wanted a challenge.



like cleaning it myself. I was delighted to volunteer my M Coupe for the tech session.

The day before the session Adam

ADAM'S CAR CLEANING TIPS

- Gently loosen stubborn spots with a fingernail, don't scrub with your towel – it will scratch the paint.
- · Microfiber towels are best, you can pay a lot of money for special towels or just use the Costco bulk towels.
- Never clean your wheels if they are hot. If you use any cleaning product on a hot wheel it can permanently stain the paint.
- For windows, use a wet side, dry side method. Spray the foaming cleaner on the wet side of the towel, wipe down the window and then wipe with the dry side. You can give the dry side a very light mist of cleaner for better results.

and sunny. I pulled up to Adam's shop and he had me park the coupe in the parking lot in front of the shop. The dark blue paint was getting a nice heat soak, but I figured that

detailing. I was surprised when Adam started with a pair of 5 gallon buckets and one very hot M Coupe. Adam explained the two bucket method and showed us how to wash a car using less than 10 gallons of water. The key is to use a cleaning product that doesn't require rinsing. Adam uses Optimum No Rinse Wash and Wax. It just takes a few capfuls in the wash water and you are ready to go. The technique is to wet your microfiber towels in the cleaning solution, clean a small section and immediately dry. The second bucket is clean water that is used to rinse the cleaning towels. Adam made guick work of the M Coupe while giving everybody



a chance to take a turn cleaning the car.

After the car was washed. Adam gave us a tutorial on cleaning the paint with clay. He finished up with the wheels and tires and the M coupe was done. It was an impressive demonstration of the performance of the system under

> worst case conditions, car in the hot sun, plain water from the tap and a bunch of people standing around watching.

> After we finished with the M Coupe, we headed over to Ryan Moore's M3 to for some

quick interior cleaning. A simple scrub





brush, some Optimum cleaner and the grey trim panel below the window was looking like new. Adam sent us home with documentation of everything he covered so that we had it for future reference. The final event of the day was a drawing for a free 5 Point detail that Adam generously donated. We raised \$150 for United Ostomy and made the

lucky winner, Jonathan King, very happy.

Adam is very knowledgeable about the art and science of auto detailing and his enthusiasm for car care was readily apparent. The two-hour session was very informative, everybody went away with at least one new

car care tip. I'm looking forward to our next tech session at 5 Point Auto Detail.

Adam offered to do a Ceramic Pro coating on my coupe as a way to show the BMW club what the technology could do. I quickly agreed to let him work on my car (see paragraph one, likes

a nice car and is lazy). Adam kept the car after the tech session and spent a long night giving it the Ceramic Pro treatment. He then came in on his day off to give me the car back.

The paint treatment was an amazing transformation. Before the treatment the paint had a ton of swirl marks and some water spotting. I had tried most of the Griot's garage products and had finally resigned myself to the slightly dull paint surface. After the treatment the paint is smooth, shiny and all the swirl marks are gone. Even my non-car crazy friends have noticed the change and complemented me on it. The only downside is that now I don't want to let the car get dirty since it looks so good clean. Luckily I purchased some Optimum cleaner and it is a quick job to wash the car so that it looks nice all the time. If you are in the market for a permanent paint coating I highly recommend Ceramic Pro as installed by Adam at 5 Point Auto Detail.






On May 31st, we saw yet another amazing Runoff. Our seventh annual Rug Cunningham Memorial Runoff was welcomed by a beautiful, sunny day and over 100 drivers who were vying for a spot in the Runoff and a chance to have their names on arguably the most important trophy of the year... The Rug Cunningham Memorial Trophy.

Our Runoff Autocross, and the spirit of competition that it represents, honors a man admired as an extraordinarily influential member of our Chapter, our local community and the BMW community. Rug was an avid collector, racer and genuine enthusiast of performance cars, especially those carrying the BMW marque. Along with his father, Allen, Rug opened Cunningham BMW in 1975. Rug and his dealership supported the CCA and, particularly, our SD Chapter. That support continues today as his former dealership, now BMW of El Cajon, sponsors our autocross program. And again this year, they brought the brats! Many thanks to Cornelia Steinberg, Brandon Watson, and Nick Owen from BMW EC for feeding our hungry drivers.

This event gives us the unique opportunity to pit driver against driver in the same car. We take the first place finishers from each of the nine classes and put them behind the wheel of the same car for two laps. To go a step further, we pick a car that we hope will be equally unfamiliar to each driver and we do not reveal the car until the first place finishers are announced. This year's car? A squirrely, and I do mean squirrely, Spec E30 racecar provided by Oceanside Motorsports who appropriately equipped it with sticky tires in front and all-seasons in the rear. Thus the challenge was not only to get a good time while not hitting cones, it was also to keep the front in front.





For example, a very fast novice could win a novice trophy and a trophy in his car class. Remember, you are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a trophy you are now a ringer, not a novice.

TIRE TECH TALK

by Nate Risch

Back in April, the Tire Rack Street Survival teams were invited to Auto Club Speedway to test out a new Michelin tire called the Premier All-Season. It's a new tire that they claim is not only "Safe When New", but also "Safe When Worn." Members from quite a few BMW CCA chapters were flown into town to not only spend a day testing out some tires, but also spend some time learning more about putting on a successful school. Unfortunately I was only able to stay for the tire testing.

The tests were fairly simple with a straightforward autocross and a braking test. To make things interesting, they proceeded to wet down the surface quite often so that the traction was minimized. The autocross was about a 40 second course, with a slalom, a few quick transition turns, and a couple decreasing radius sweepers. The braking test was set up like a drag strip. Line up at the cone, wait for the go signal, accelerate as quickly as you can to 50 mph, then slam on the brake as hard as you can so that the ABS activates.

Michelin provided us with quite a few identically prepared Cadillac CTSs. Both the autocross and the braking tests had six dedicated cars, each with different tires. Two were set up with different brand-new economy all-season tires, two were on different brand-new premium all-seasons, and two were on 50% worn Michelin Premier A/S tires. Thus, you were testing the worn Michelin tire against a wide range of tires.

I started at the autocross, not knowing which tire I was on when I started off. It was a little sloppy, didn't transition well, and really didn't like to accelerate out of the corner as the traction control would kick in and really limit the throttle. When you finished the lap, you jumped out of one CTS, and then right into another—making it really easy to compare the tires side-by-side.

I hopped in to the next car and immediately the car felt

more planted and was much more responsive, it wasn't my M3 on Pilot Super Sports, but it was pretty good. The traction control wasn't as intrusive, and I had much more control of the

car, it was clearly better than the last tire. I jumped into the third car for the next round and it was right back to being like that first tire. At this point we all knew it wasn't as good so some of us just started to have fun with the low traction these competitor tires provided. The second tire was hands-down better than the other two, and it was the half-worn! After the test I found out that this was the round where I was testing out the Premier A/S against other premium tires. I won't bore you with the economy tire tests as I am sure you can guess the results.

The braking test is one of the most fun for me. It's not every day where you get to accelerate as quickly as you can to 50 mph and then smash the brake pedal hard! There is just something about it that I really enjoy. During this test there was a VBOX vehicle testing system in the car that uses a highly accurate GPS system to measure the vehicles dynamics. The cool part was that I didn't even need the VBOX, the difference was so dramatic that anyone could see it!

I was amazed that a tire that is worn down to 50% of its tread depth can outperform its top competitors when they are brand new. If you want to read more about the new Michelin Premier A/S tire, I wrote a thorough write-up on it in the March-April edition of the Fahren Affairs newsletter that is available on our website, www.sdbmwcca.com.


