








Course on Course Design January 25, 2014



BMW Motorsport Monologue by Nate Risch

Sports car racing in North America started off with a bang as the season kicked off at Daytona International Raceway for the Continental Tire SportsCar Challenge BMW 200 and the Tudor United Sportscar Championship Rolex 24 Hours.

After the Roar Before the 24 testing back in early January, BMW Team RLL exhibited the same issue as they had all last season, a lack of top speed. Thus, they were really hoping to get some Balance of Power (BOP) adjustments before the Rolex 24. Surprisingly they did not get an adjustment, and to make matters worse, one of the fastest teams last year received a weight reduction and a larger fuel capacity. With the high-speed requirement of Daytona, BMW was going to have to win on strategy and luck.

Joining BMW Team RLL at the Rolex 24 was the long time BMW privateer team, Turner Motorsports. Turner Motorsports stepped up to the top series by picking up a BMW Z4 GT3 chassis from Marc VDS Racing, who contends in the Blancpain Endurance Series in Europe. Their Z4 had to go through some refinements to change it from GT3 spec to GTD spec, and the new Z4 looked great in the Turner yellow and blue livery.

But to kick off the weekend, there was the very entertaining Continental Tire SportsCar Challenge BMW 200. This support series has quite a few big names driving in it and even factory supported teams, it is growing into quite a premier series. The race was plagued with caution periods, but as the clock wound down, BMWs kept moving to the front. And when the checkered flag fell, BMW had secured the top 6 positions in the GS class with Turner Motorsports Bill Auberlen and Paul Dalla Lana taking the victory in their M3. In the ST class, BMW took the top 2 positions with Murillo Racing taking the victory in a 328i driven by Eric Foss and Jeff Mosing.

After the race concluded though, Turner Motorsports failed the post race tech inspection and the win has given to FallLine Motorsports and their drivers Ashley Freiberg and Shelby Blackstock. Even though this was a big disappointment for long-time BMW racing fans, it was great to see fan favorite Ashley Freiberg get a big win her first time in a BMW. This was a great start to the weekend for BMW Motorsport and everyone was hoping for similar results in the Rolex 24.

The driver lineup for BMW Motorsport for the Rolex 24 was very strong, pulling people from all aspects of racing. For BMW Team RLL, the black #55 Z4 GTLM was driven by BMW stalwart Bill Auberlen, Joey Hand who has won the 24 before in a BMW powered Daytona Prototype, GT3 hot shoe Maxime Martin, and 3-time World Touring Car Champion Andy Priaulx. The white #56 was

driven by longtime BMW factory driver Dirk Muller, Dirk Werner, rising star and newest factory driver John Edwards, and Indy Car star Graham Rahal. For Turner Motorsports, their Z4 GTD was piloted by Dane Cameron, BMW factory DTM driver Augusto Farfus, Paul Dalla Lana, and Markus Palttala, who has lots of experience in the Marc VDS Racing Z4 GT3 whom Turner got their car.

Since BMW Motorsport struggled with top speed on the banking of Daytona, they didn't qualify very well. John Edwards was P7 in the #56 and Andy Priaulx was P8 in the #55, with both being over 1.2 seconds behind the top qualifier in GTLM. Turner Motorsport didn't fare any better, qualifying 12th with Augusto Farfus behind the wheel Z4 GTD.

The race started out uneventfully with next to no contact in the first corner. The race stayed that way up until just before sunset when a horrific accident happened between a GT car and a Prototype. One of the Ferraris had started to slow just as a Prototype was making a pass on another car. The Prototype went to overtake on the driver side, but did not see the slowed Ferrari, and rear-ended him with a monstrous blow. Both drivers were taken immediately to the hospital, and thankfully both survived.

> Throughout the night BMW slowly started to pick their way through the field with a strategy of staying out of trouble, and staying on track. At the halfway mark, the #55 was in third and the #56 was in sixth. With the sun coming up three quarters of the way through the race, and with the team already completed 500 laps, the #55 was still holding third and the #56 had worked its way up to fourth. Both cars were looking strong and had a good chance at not only taking a

podium position, but also possibly winning!

But as the clock kept ticking, the high banked oval of Daytona started to take its toll on the right rear wheel bearing of the white #56 car and it had to be brought into the pits for repair. After about 15 to 20 minutes it was back out on track but had dropped a few positions and did not have enough time to make up the lost laps.

The #55 on the other hand was continuing to look strong and Bill Auberlen had an awesome morning stint working his way up to second with only 2 hours to go. Bill then handed the car off to Joey Hand and he set out on a charge and slowly started to real in the very fast Porsche! With 20 minutes to go a full course caution fell over the track to pack up the cars for a sprint to the finish. Joey gave it his all, but the Z4 was no match for the top end of the Porsche.

As the checkered flag fell after 24 hours of racing, the white #55 finished second, less than 3 seconds behind the overall GT winner. The black #56 wound up securing some great points with a fourth place finish. And after an amazing closing stint by Augusto Farfus, Turner Motorsports finished P7 in their Z4 GTD.

It was a great result for BMW Motorsport considering this was their first time at the Rolex 24. After the first race of the new IMSA Tudor United SportsCar Championship they sit second in the points at 32, just 3 points behind Porsche. What a great start to the new combined racing series as it produced great racing right up until the end. Fun Fact: The first radial tire patent, #US1203910 was filed on May 21, 1915 by Arthur Savage, owner of the Savage Tire company in San Diego, CA, www. google.com/patents/US1203910

Major advancements in tires don't come around very often. With "the" major step being the first radial tires produced by Michelin back in 1946,

This new EverGrip technology not only stops shorter on wet roads than the leading competitors' brand new tires, it also can out stop their brand new tires when they are worn. The tire combines hidden grooves that emerge as the tire wears down, expanding rain grooves that widen over time to continue to evacuate water, and a unique rubber compound for increased wet grip.

Here are the details of these three technologies from the Michelin USA press release at the North American International Auto Show:

- Emerging Grooves: Initially hidden when the tire is new, MICHELIN Premier A/S with EverGrip has another set of grooves along the tire's shoulder that emerge as the tire becomes worn. More than 150 hidden grooves emerge to provide additional help in channeling water away and maintaining wet traction as miles are logged.
- Expanding Rain Grooves: In most tires, as the rain grooves lose depth, the amount of water they can funnel away from the tire is

diminished. MICHELIN Premier A/S with EverGrip has rain grooves positioned around the circumference of the tire with a special geometric shape that gets wider as the tread wears. This helps maintain the amount of water that the tire can channel away even as these rain grooves lose depth.




