

## Saving Teen Lives with Street Survival





The San Diego Chapter of the BMW CCA conducted its sixth Tire Rack Street Survival School at Qualcomm Stadium on Sunday, April 6th. The school, using both classroom and driving exercises, trains teenagers on how to properly react to emergency situations that can occur on the street.

First of all, the San Diego Chapter would like

to thank the 40 unpaid instructors and volunteers who made this year's Street Survival school a big success. Also, thanks go to our local corporate sponsor, Mossy BMW of Vista, as well as to the United Truck Driving School for providing an 18-wheeler, and BMW of El Cajon for providing air bags to detonate during the air bag demonstration.

After the students checked in and registered, instructors showed the students how to conduct a tech inspection on their

cars, checking for loose items in the trunk and car,

as well as the proper way to check coolant, oil, and tire pressure. Tire Rack provided air gauges for each student. Students drove their own daily drivers – a few BMWs, but mostly other makes.

The school started with a short classroom session giving an overview of the instruction and preparing the students for their first driving exercise – panic braking. When the students filed into the classroom and took their seats, they were not very enthusiastic because they were in a classroom on a Sunday instead of having a day off from school. However, after we got the students in their cars and driving, attitudes began improving. After they completed the braking exercise and came back into the classroom, their attitude began to change for the better, and they began to pay closer attention because they were relating the classroom learning with the driving exercises.

As the day progressed, the students tackled different exercises: emergency braking, brake and turn, emergency lane change, slalom, and skid pad. To teach the students how to control their vehicles under adverse conditions, we used a water truck to wet down the parking lot. We even added biodegradable soap to the water to make things extremely slippery. We wanted the pavement to be very slippery so the cars begin slipping at relatively slow speeds which is a safer way to teach handling a car at the limits of traction.

During lunch, the students parked their cars around an 18-wheeler and then climbed into the cab to see how extremely limited the truck driver's visibility is. Nick Owen, the BMW CCA Pacific Region Vice President and our demolitions expert, set off three airbags during lunch to demonstrate the 170 mile per hour explosion that goes off in your face during an accident.



After lunch there was more classroom instruction and driving. The final driving exercise connected the emergency lane change, two skid pads (which were turned into a figure eight), and the slalom into a single exercise that was a little bit like an autocross.

Special thanks go to Rich Gehring, the Chief Steward and Course Designer, Kelley Moon, the Chief Instructor, and Skip Augustine (who helped me with the classroom portion) for making this year's Street Survival a big success.



## BMW Motorsport Monologue by Nate Risch

### The 12 Hours of Sebring

The second longest race on the calendar is also the second race of the year. After opening the season at the Daytona 24 Hours, the series stayed in Florida for the 12 Hours of Sebring which is termed, "The Longest Half-Day in Racing".

Team BMW Motorsport had a successful Sebring qualifying. Dane Cameron piloted the Turner Motorsport Z4 GTD to take the pole position in the GTD class. In the GTLM class, Bill Auberlen took P3 in the #55 Black Beast and Dirk Müller took P2 in the #56! This was a great start to the weekend, but the race is long.

Three hours into the race and the #56 was involved in an accident that caused some damage to the front left side of the car. Dirk Werner limped the car back to the pits and Team RLL went to work getting it back out on the track. The team had to replace the whole front clip of the car, and unfortunately when they sent it back out, they didn't get the hood secured. Thus, they had to bring the car back into the pits to get it latched properly. Unfortunately this put them way back in the pack and they were unable to come back from this set-back.

On the other hand, the #55 car was looking strong and hanging back, waiting for its time to pounce. And as we reached the halfway point, Joey Hand had moved up into P2. In the GTD class, Turner Motorsport was looking very strong as young gun Dane Cameron was laying down some quick laps and had them sitting comfortably in first place.

Two-thirds the way into the race and the bad luck had spread to the #55 car as something went wrong with pit lane speed limiter. Andy Priaulx came in for a pit stop and was penalized for exceeding the pit lane speed limit. Then when he came in to serve his penalty, it happened again. This happened four times in a row; that's right four!

As darkness fell over Sebring International Raceway, the #55 BMW Motorsport GTLM car proceeded to make its move. Jumping in for the last stint, Joey Hand took over for Bill Auberlen and proceeded to pick off the leaders one-by-one. Starting his stint in P6, Joey worked his way through the field up to P3, looking at the tail lights of the Viper in P2, but unfortunately was unable to track him down. Hindered by the multiple pit lane speed violation penalties earlier in the race, the BMW Black Beast made it on to the final step on the podium.

The #56 of Dirk Müller, John Edwards, and Dirk Werner just couldn't shake their bad luck. Dropping all the way down to P10 and 10 laps down, they were able to make up quite a few laps, but it wasn't enough. In the closing laps, John

reported that oil had be splattered on the windshield, making it very hard to navigate the track in the dark. Thus at the end of the day, it was like the car was covering its eyes in disgust.

Turner Motorsport, who had been hanging out in or around the lead all day, would succumb to the close racing of the GTD class and some tough traffic to finish P7. Dane Cameron and Markus Palttala proved that they would be a force to reckon with this season as they showed some serious speed in the new Z4 GTD!

With the 3rd place finish by the #55 car, Joey Hand, Bill Auberlen, & Andy Priaulx now sit atop the TUDOR Championship points standings! Next race is in Long Beach, CA for the Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach on April 11 & 12.

### Patron Tequila Sports Car Showcase at Long Beach

After the two longest races on the calendar, the Tudor Championship headed to the streets of Long Beach for the shortest race of the year at 100 minutes. The tight twisty track suits the Z4s of Team BMW Motorsport perfectly, and after finishing first and second last year, were looking for another great result.

The weather was perfect and after a short practice session, Bill Auberlen and Dirk Müller headed out into the setting sun for qualifying. It only took them a couple of laps before they were near the top of the time sheet. They were so confident with their times, that they came in early and watched as no one else could knock them off. Bill had qualified P2 in the #55 and Dirk was P3 in the #56.

For the start of the race, Andy Priaulx would be in the #55 and John Edwards in the #56. The start was anticlimactic, which was a surprise as the streets of Long Beach seem to collect cars at that start. For the first 30 minutes of the race, the top four stayed the same: Corvette, #55 BMW, #56 BMW, Corvette. Unfortunately the two BMWs got stuck behind a slow prototype and lost precious seconds to the Corvette.

The lead Corvette was the first to dive into the pits, which lead to just about everyone following, except for the #55. Andy Priaulx stayed out and tried to lay down a hot lap in open air to make up for lost time, but as he dove into the pits, he clipped the passenger mirror knocking it off. The Tudor Championship requires both mirrors, thus Team RLL had to quickly replace the door, losing valuable time.

John Edwards had a good first stint and handed it off to Dirk Müller to finish the race. With no caution periods throughout the entire race though, Dirk was unable to catch the lead



Corvette. He did have a great drive to hold off the Corvette of Tommy Milner right behind him though. And as the flag dropped he was able to secure the second place finish and valuable points for the team.

With their sixth place finish, Bill Auberlen and Andy Priaulx still hold on to the Driver's Championship points lead by just two points. Dirk Müller and John Edwards move up to fourth place. In the Manufacturers' Championship, BMW is still second just six points behind Porsche. Next up is the shortened race at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca which is always a tough fight.

Your instructor will then ride with you for your next three laps helping you learn the course. In your next session, and the timed runs, you can have an instructor with you as much or as little as you want—whatever makes you comfortable. These events are what you make them; you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

Note: We do run if it's raining—you'll learn more and your tires will wear less—so if you see some unusual drops of water falling from the sky, grab your raingear and head to the Q! Also, the helmet standard has changed to require Snell 2005 or 2010 ratings. Check yours now to be sure it's up to date-rentals are limited.

The entry fee is \$65, including breakfast items, lunch and beverages. You can pay online if you register in advance at http://sdbmwcca.motorsportreg.com, or with cash or check if you wait to register onsite. You must be a BMW CCA member to participate, and you can join online at www.bmwcca. org in advance. Please print and bring your membership confirmation if you have not yet received your BMW CCA membership card. We check membership of all participants at the gate.

### When you arrive:

1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.

- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a **mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am** and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

ANY other performance modification, including but not limited to springs, "R"-compound tires, and engine software for turbocharged/supercharged cars, puts the car in Modified, Non-DOT tires (i.e. slicks) on any car place it in Gold Class. All cars must be under a 92 dB noise level to be driven at Qualcomm—and we'll be checking. Our car classes are kept simple so we can use the honor system. Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We also award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. For example, a very fast novice could win a novice trophy and a trophy in his car class. Remember, you are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a trophy you are now a ringer, not a novice.

# ONE-OFF ONE M3

For over 25 years, I've been going to the track for BMW CCA driving schools. A wonderful thing, we all can agree. But there is one small problem in a BMW-rich paddock: it's a sea of black, white, gray and silver. Not wanting to lose my car in the crowd, I've always ordered my BMWs in a distinctive color. Calypso Red E34, Individual Aqua E36 M3 with ultrarare Grey Alcantara seats, Biarritz Blue E39 (then a 7-series color), Imola Red E46 M3 with Cinnamon leather. OK, my NSX track car was black, but I managed to find it without too much trouble.




At the November, 1995 LA Auto Show, BMW NA displayed a special-ordered E36 convertible from BMW Individual in a striking deep blue-green called Aegean Blue. Contrasted with a Champagne full-leather interior, it was the most unique BMW color I'd ever seen. At the time, my new Aquametallic M3 was on a ship, and I began to question whether I'd ordered the right Individual color. Years later, I saw Aegean Blue again on a 7-Series displayed at the Individual Boutique in Munich, leaving me as intrigued as ever. As the topic of interesting colors came up with friends over the years, I

mentioned Aegean Blue as my elusive favorite that no one else had ever seen.

After selling my Imola Red M3 to a close friend and driving a ZHP, fate took an interesting turn. Autocross regular Mike Yip emailed me a link to an eBay auction for. . . an Aegean Blue E46 M3! I wasn't really looking for a car at the time, but I clicked on it and discovered that the auction had ended with the car unsold. This 2 year-old car had just 14,000 miles on it, featured the uber-





M3). Though it also had SMG (my second-favorite transmission), everything else pushed all the right buttons, and it was nearby in Scottsdale, AZ. I HAD to have it!

Simple, just email or call the seller and negotiate a price and pick it up. Uh... no. Email inquiries went unanswered, and I couldn't appear TOO interested and try EVERY day. This went on for a while and drove me crazy; I NEEDED it more with each passing day. Then I noticed the seller had other items for sale; I clicked on them and found a phone number that was

answered. The actual owner was a private developer who asked a friend to manage the eBay sale; when the auction ended he stopped monitoring that email account. In no time we agreed on a price and I flew to Phoenix before anything could change. It was everything I'd hoped for, looking perfect and showing every bit of its original \$61K window sticker. I got a certified check and drove it home.

I already had a set of 9.5 X 18 SSR track wheels and a Hartge center-exit exhaust from the last M3. Before hitting the track, I had the leading edges wrapped with clear paint

protection and chose a TC Kline coilover suspension and adjustable camber plates, later adding a Dinan air flow meter and software. This E46 became quite entertaining, with so much stick in front that the handling could be balanced to neutral-to-oversteer. Over the years, motivated by my long-

time friend Tim Yost at Autobahn West,

Euro cross-drilled rotors and Competition Package wheels and an anti-rasp exhaust pipe were added, along with Mr. Dinan's cold air intake, high-flow muffler and massaged 3.91 limited slip. Each mod tailored the M3 more and more to my taste and driving enjoyment.

A year ago, an opportunity came up to dip deeper into the well that is BMW Individual. Autobahn West acquired an M3 with a genuine Individual interior in Light Ecru Nappa leather. Tim and I agreed that my rare Alcantara seats would suit his red M3 better for selling, and I could achieve the classic dark metallic/light leather Individual look on my car if we did an interior swap. And we were right; both cars benefitted from the exchange. Finally, even though I didn't order this M3 new, it has become what I would have ordered! (Well, except for that missing third pedal, but that's a problem with an eventual solution). Turning just 65K miles in its first 10 years, the M3 even still performs like a new BMW. A recent highlight for me was being chosen to represent all E46 M3s, along with an E30, E36 and E92 M3, to embody BMW's full lineage when the F82 M4 was given a big-deal reveal at BMW CCA's Oktoberfest last Fall. E46's are the last M3s with BMW's classic naturally-aspirated 6-cylinder engine, and I feel fortunate to have a one-of-a-kind example featuring BMW Individual inside and out. I think it's a keeper.


