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

Affordable Classic: 1988-91 BMW M3 A Boy Racer for the Ages By Steve Johnson

At first glance, the BMW M3 looks like a boy racer's dream. You see a big air dam, a big spoiler and big wheels rolling under big flares.

You have to get into this car, start it and roll it down the road before you know exactly what the BMW M3 car is all about. In its first four years of production, it won more races and titles than any other BMW ever – and it is still the most successful racing saloon of all time.

The M3 represents a purity of purpose that BMW had not shown before — or since. The car was developed in reverse order of most – if not all – of the production cars



given the designation \$14. The crank was stout enough in the S14 to sustain revs at 10,000 rpm, which was much greater than the 6-cylinder engine. Amazingly, Rosche developed the first 4-cylinder prototype in just 14 days, hence the engine name S14.

Other differences from the 6-cylinder 3 series included five-lug wheels as opposed to four lugs. There are box-flared wheel arches to accommodate the larger wheels, a large front air dam with side aero package and an extended C-pillar to help air flow to the added large rear wing.

All this is why some refer to this car as the "boy racer." That's okay, as there is real power and performance under the glitz.

The M3 features special brake calipers and

rotors on all four wheels and a Getrag 5-speed gearbox. The engine performance was – and still is – stunning. The U.S. version of the 2.3-liter engine hit 62 mph in 6.9 seconds – with a top speed of 143 mph.

This same engine, which is what you'll find in most M3s living in the United States, puts out 192 horsepower at 6,750 rpm and tons of torque. These are outstanding numbers even today, more than two decades later.

The 197-hp engine in the much-coveted Sport EVO version topped out at more than 150 mph.

of today. BMW first developed the race version of the M3 and then made it into a saleable homologation. Some will argue the M1 also fits this, but the E30 M3 was designed to go racing first, then became a road car. The M1 was developed as a sports car and then as a racer.

The tightly wound, high-revving 4-cylinder engine was developed in the mid-1980s by Paul Rosche, technical director of BMW M GmbH. Rosche chose to use an existing 4-cylinder engine — and the head from the iconic M1 – after chopping off two cylinders.

Rosche chose the 4-cylinder block rather than the 6-cylinder because the larger crankshaft would take longer to vibrate in the 4-cylinder engine. The new engine was



Go ahead and say "boy racer" now. The car was – and still is – an autobahn stud.

A DRIVER'S CAR

All this equipment made for a very successful rally and race car. It's also a wonderful driver as a sports car. In 2007, Automobile Magazine named the M3 as one of the Top 5 greatest driver's cars of all time.

Driving this car rewards the driver with crisp turn-ins and fabulous brakes. A vibration runs through this car, the mirror shakes, the shifter vibrates and the throttle feels like that of a race car.

in the hands of a competent driver. Because of its excellent balance and horsepower-to-weight ratio, higher entry speeds and exit speeds are the reward. This car puts a huge smile on my face every time I drive it.

The M3 was introduced to the United States during the 1988 model year, and



it sold out in no time. The car was not cheap, at a base sticker price of \$34,950 plus dealer cost.

Sales slowed during the 1989 model year – some cars stayed on the dock – because of the much higher sticker

price than the standard 3 Series BMW. Because of this, there is a small group – mine included – of 1989 cars titled as 1990 cars. In addition, these cars have some cost-cutting measures, such as no opening rear windows, heated seats or airbags. The

real 1990 cars have airbags.

PURE JOY ON THE ROAD

The E30 M3 set the bar for a race car that could be sold as a street car; no other car re creates the handling and pure joy of driving that comes from the E30 M3. For me, it's the peak of the mountain, and everything else is just not quite as good. I, like most SCMers, have a few cars, but the M3 is my favorite to drive.

The SCM Pocket Price Guide gives the E30 M3 a collectibility rating of "C" and values them in the \$12,000 to \$22,000 range. I'm guessing these are pedestrian cars, as I see plenty of M3 sales in the mid-\$20k range with great regularity for good cars. Really good, low-mileage, unmolested cars sell into the \$30k range.

I know I would not even consider a number under \$20,000 for my car. Publisher Martin can attest to that, as he has asked to buy my car, which still puts a smile on my face.

NOT A COMMUTER CAR

This is not an everyday driving car. The ride is slightly harsh, the steering is heavy and it's loud. The mechanicals are complicated, and you can expect to dish out \$15,000 for a typical rebuild.

Like many other special cars, this one attracts a hard-core group of followers. The Special Interest Group (E30 M3 SIG) is a very active worldwide forum that is helpful to any potential owner. And, of course, there's the BMW Club of America. (shameless plug).

The E30 M3 was produced

in three models: the base 2.3-liter version, the Cabriolet, and the much-sought-after sport EVO with its larger 2.5-liter engine. Both the Cabriolet and the Sport EVO did not make it to the United States in their initial runs. Since then, a few have made it over here. They cost the moon and the skies, but, yes, I want one of them.

You can call me a boy racer anytime.

NEWCOMERS: We've all had a first time and we're all still learning, so relax, have fun and enjoy your time with us. You will have an instructor take you around the course for one lap in your car showing you turn-in points, braking zones and so on. Your instructor will then ride with you for your next three laps helping you learn the course. In your next session, and the timed runs, you can have an instructor with you as much or as little as you want—whatever makes you comfortable. These events are what you make them; you can push for good lap times and enjoy the friendly competition or you can have more of a social event where running laps is just another part of a fun-filled day.

See the Autocross Tips at www.sdbmwcca.com to get a better idea of how to prepare for this wonderfully addictive sport for your first time.

Note: We do run if it's raining—you'll learn more and your tires will wear less—so if you see some unusual drops of water falling from the sky, grab your raingear and head to the Q! Also, the helmet standard has changed to require Snell 2005 or 2010 ratings. Check yours now to be sure it's up to date—rentals are limited.

REMEMBER: IF REGISTERED ONLINE, BRING PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP AND ARRIVE BY 7:30 (BEFORE ONSITE CUT-OFF) TO KEEP YOUR RESERVED SPOT

When you arrive:

- 1. If you registered online, stop at the gate to sign the waiver and notify the Gate Greeter. Your name will be checked off the pre-registration list. All participants must show their BMW CCA membership card. Those who did not register online will receive a numbered card at the gate in their order of arrival; take it to the Registration table. There is no guarantee that spots will be available for those who wait to register the day of the event.
- 2. Empty all loose items from your car, then go through the Tech Line and have your car inspected. Bring your Tech card and you will receive Tech and helmet stickers.
- 3. Take Gate card and Tech card to Registration to get checked off for pre-registration or pay your \$65 entry fee. You will receive car numbers to place on your side windows.
- 4. If you don't have a helmet, you can rent one from the club for \$10.
- 5. Your entry fee of \$65.00 includes one lunch and unlimited beverages. Additional lunches can be purchased at Registration for \$7 each.

Gates will open at 6:30am; tech and registration will open at 7:00am. Tech will close at 8:20am and no cars will be inspected or allowed to run after this time. There is a mandatory drivers meeting at 8:30am and the course opens for runs at 9:00am.

opt-in drivers, and cars with slick tires

Stock classes permit any size wheel and tire; non-stock shock absorbers, bushings and strut braces; any brake pad material (brakes must be stock-size), any air filter or cold air intake or cat-back exhaust; and naturally-aspirated cars may use aftermarket engine management software. Tires must be 140 treadwear rated or higher in Stock. ANY other performance modification, including but not limited to springs, "R"-compound tires, and engine software for turbocharged/supercharged cars, puts the car in Modified. Non-DOT tires (i.e. slicks) on any car place it in Gold Class. All cars must be under a 92 dB noise level to be driven at Qualcomm—and we'll be checking. Our car classes are kept simple so we can use the honor system.



Women drivers and Novices are classified based upon the car they are driving. We also award a Women's Class trophy to the woman with the fastest time, and two Novice trophies to the two fastest novices. This means women and novices will be eligible for multiple trophies. For example, a very fast novice could win a novice trophy and a trophy in his car class. Remember, you are only a novice for the first and second time you autocross, and if you win a trophy you are now a ringer, not a novice.

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Three Feet for Safety Act Effective September 16

While out enjoying California's highways and byways, be aware that a new law – Three Feet for Safety Act (AB 1371) – takes effect that requires motorists that are passing a bicycle to have at least 3 feet of clearance from the bicycle.

- 1. This new law defines "safe distance" as three-feet when passing cyclists traveling in the same direction.
- 2. If not enough space is available, the motorist must slow down and pass when no danger is present to the bicyclist.
- 3. Violators will face a \$35 fine, as well as a \$220 fine if a collision occurs.
- 4. Law takes effect September 16, 2014.

Equipmentmeister – Rich Gehring




